A2. Your ranking.	I give this 3.5 out of 5 points. It has a good message about faith, flows well and has a solid story line.

A4. What are the greatest strengths and weaknesses of this script?	Its strength are the characters which are likable and solid. I also like that they are down to earth and realistic. Its weakness is that it is religious and may not appeal to all children in the recommended target age range, but it flows well and makes sense. It is somewhat based on The Ten Commandments. It is well written.
A5. Do you believe this script has commercial potential? Why or why not?	Yes, it would be an excellent film to be shown around the Easter Holiday. I do not believe that you have to be very religious to enjoy the film. It is entertaining and, in some sense, has a wonderful message about putting family above everything else.
