

Michele Noble is a writer, director and producer of award -winning narrative feature films and documentary films. In 2021, she became an Emmy® nominated filmmaker with her powerful documentary, *Reclamation: The Rise at Standing Rock* (2020). Ms. Noble directed, produced and wrote *Reclamation* which also won 25 top Jury Awards and was selected at over 40 film festivals worldwide. During the eleven months of filming at Standing Rock, Ms. Noble joined the frontlines as an ally in solidarity with the Native Nations and their peaceful resistance against the Dakota Access Pipeline.

While still in film school at the University of Southern California, she directed *Runaway Dreams* (1990) a feature film written by John Hopkins (*Smiley's People*), which won honors at the Deauville Film Festival and was distributed by Sony Pictures. Ms. Noble's feature documentary, *Journey 4 Artists* (2014), featuring actor/activist/singer, Theodore Bikel, contemplates the power of music as a bridge to heal histories of war and genocide between cultures and was honored with a Grand Prize at the Oscar qualifying Rhode Island International Film Festival and Best Director at Roving Eye Festival. Ms. Noble was also celebrated when she wrote, directed, and produced the experimental narrative film, *the Revolution*, depicting political activists of the 1960s. The dynamic cast included Kathryn Erbe, Adam Rothenberg, James Roday, Merritt Wever, Gale Harold and Jennifer Carpenter.

Ms. Noble's work often centers around themes of social justice. She is a member of the Writers Guild and Directors Guild of America and the Television Academy.
