WELCOME TO THE SIXTH FRINGE! QUEER FILM & ARTS FESTIVAL!

AN ECLECTIC WEEK OF FILM, PERFORMANCE, DISCUSSIONS, WORKSHOPS & PARTIES ACROSS EAST LONDON.

We are more than excited to bring you another week packed with queer film, debate, performance, parties and shenanigans for a sixth year running. This year's festival has been honed and condensed to refocus on stories prescient in the queer community right now: the queer families we are evolving and creating; overcoming homophobia and bullying; taking a closer look at legendary and emerging ballroom culture.

20 features, 66 shorts films, performance, workshops, and parties will cover a circuit of nine East London venues over 6 days. We're exploring new territories this year at Fringe! Weekend hub space at Hackney Showroom and taking over Jujus for our first ever voguing ball!

Whether it is the struggles and triumphs with our biological families or those that we chose and make ourselves, the family has emerged as a dominant theme in this year's programme. Opening film Viva and the life of a young Cuban hairdresser, initiated into Havana's drag scene while trying to reinvigorate a relationship with his estranged father. Chosen families also shine through a Hijra family in India, voguing houses in the US, and an inseparable band of Brazilian misfit punk queers. We invite you to join us for a Queer Family Sunday Brunch and short film programme all about the ties that bind.

Voguing and ballroom culture feature prominently. The incredible Strike a Pose is an emotional catch up with the dancers from In Bed With Madonna aka Truth or Dare, while the insightful Kiki shows that

the US ballroom scene is alive and kicking more than 25 years after Paris is Burning. After Kiki join us for a night of ecstatic dancing and prancing at the Ab Fab Vogue Ball hosted by English Breakfast London and on Sunday get a unique UK perspective on the subject at our cozy roundtable Let's Have a Kiki.

And importantly, we pay tribute to one of the major tragedies this year - June's shocking attack on one of our safe spaces in Orlando - by telling both fictional and factual global stories of LGBT rights, fighting homophobia and resilience in the face of bullying. These diverse accounts feature Check It, a revolutionary queer street gang in Washington DC; a father seeking justice for his gay son in Chile to prove You'll Never Be Alone; Utopians delve into pansexual romp and undermine antiquated imperial laws Hong Kong; The Same Difference confronts oppressive gender performance and lesbian-on-lesbian discrimination; and an Italian teenager providing some rare light relief on the subject with A Little Lust.

There is also something of a transmasculine moment and celebration of female masculinity happening this year as we enter A Womb of Their Own with a diverse group of masculine-identified pregnant people who have a thing or two to say about gender identity and parenthood, a smattering of short films, club night Butch, Please!, and culminating in the uplifting and revelatory Closing film that has us all Suited and booted.

Encouraged by his mentor, Mama, Jesus finally gets his chance to take the stage. But when his estranged father Angel abruptly reenters his life, his world is quickly turned upside down. As father and son clash over their opposing expectations of each other, VIVA develops into a love story as they struggle to understand one another and reconcile as a family.

VIVA is a moving drama that packs an emotional punch with its portrayal of families, from those we adopt to those we are born into while illustrating the every day struggles of ordinary Cubans and the transformative power of drag.
