Synopsis:

At a breaking point in her life, **Cris** finds herself repeating the same destructive pattern that has defined her relationships. But for the first time, she has the awareness to see it — and the power to choose differently. **Park La Brea** is a haunting, intimate exploration of Borderline Personality Disorder and the thin line between perception and reality. As Cris hovers between self-destruction and self-realization, the film poses its central question:

IS MADNESS A CHOICE?

Director's Note

As an actress, I've spent years studying human behavior from the inside out—analyzing emotional truth, contradiction, and the subconscious patterns that drive decision-making. Writing and directing **PARK LA BREA** allowed me to move beyond interpreting character and into constructing the full psychological world around it. Choosing to also perform the lead role was a deliberate extension of that process—allowing for a level of intimacy and control over the character's internal experience that felt essential to the story, as this story is based on my lived experience and is rooted in a question I continue to return to: once we become aware of our patterns, do we have the ability to choose differently—and if so, does that awareness become our responsibility?

Filmmaker Background

Cuban-American filmmaker Bevin Bru was born and raised in Miami, Florida, and is currently a series regular on ABC's *RJ Decker*. With a career spanning network television and independent film, her experience on professional sets has shaped her understanding of performance, tone, and visual storytelling. **PARK LA BREA** marks her directorial debut and the beginning of her transition into filmmaking, with a focus on psychologically driven narratives that explore identity, perception, and the complexity of human behavior.

Project Status

Currently in post-production. Funding will support final sound design, music licensing, mix, and cost for submission to festivals such as SXSW, Tribeca, Palm Springs ShortFest, Clermont-Ferrand, and other festivals highlighting mental health and emerging voices in cinema.
