These windows into the past take us to a childhood marked by struggles with addiction and mental health. As he tries to overcome the emotional turmoil, James reaches out to people from his past and seeks creative outlets for his feelings. Preoccupied by the loss of people he could not save, James must face his own struggles while attempting to help those left behind.

“**Now Again**” is a deeply personal take on the complex path we all navigate in life while moving forward to create meaningful lives. The film offers authentic insight into what to expect after grief and trauma. It shows how addiction can affect people left behind when loved ones succumb to their demons. The film urges viewers to embrace those around them and reach out when they need help.

“Now Again” is the debut feature film of writer **Louis Cox** and producer **Dave Morrissey Jr.** both from New York City. It stars actor **John Kroner** in a powerful introduction. The project began during the director’s school days and finished after the loss of his brother, father, and mother. Editing was completed during pandemic quarantine. It was awarded Best Script at **The Queen Palm International**. An earlier Director’s Cut was selected for publication by **The New Yorker** in March 2021.
