

Millie Blake has always been a perfectionist. A soccer star and straight A student, her main focus is on her future. So receiving a month of community service at a local nursing home, after trying to break up a fight at school - not how she pictured the start of her senior year of high school.

To make matters worse, Millie is stuck at the nursing home with the instigator of the fight: Andy Wellick. She is another senior student, who is outspoken about her identity as a lesbian. Meanwhile, Millie is distancing herself from her friends, who grow more curious about her relationship with Andy. As her and Andy's friendship buds into something more, tensions rise amongst the friend group, as they dislike the amount of time Millie and Andy spend together.

Their growing relationship hits a snag when Andy's homophobic mother keeps Andy home from Millie's soccer game. Distracted by Andy's absence, Millie plays poorly in front of a talent scout, ruining her chances at a scholarship. Millie lashes out at those around her, leading to a fight with Andy.

Brokenhearted, and confused, Millie inadvertently admits her feelings for Andy to her mother, surprising her with the revelation that her daughter is gay. After a heart to heart with her mother about her identity, she finally has the guts to come out to her friends and reconcile with Andy.
