Joe Malone's dream of a thirty-two county, Socialist Republic died in 1987 when the Brits executed his fiancée during a shoot-to-kill operation. The war had cost him dearly: the only woman he loved and his old man. He was finished with Ireland and emigrated to America where he changed his name to Rumpleman.

Thirty years later, thoughts of revenge still burn brightly. He meets an Indian national by the name of Ishir Sanyal in a dingy Manhattan bar on 59th Street. Sanyal is a millionaire software developer who sold an app to the right people at the right time. He lives in a mansion on the Alicante Coast of Spain and he's even more bitter than Malone about the Evil Empire. He befriends Rumpleman because the Irish get things done. Twice, they almost wiped out the British cabinet including the Prime Minister, once in Brighton and once in London during the Iraq war. The rest of the world suspected Saddam Hussein, but Sanyal knew it could only be the Irish.

After his family's tragedy in India, he moved to Dublin, receiving a degree in electronic engineering from Trinity College. He speaks Joe's language and is prepared to strike back at the heart of evil that has robbed them of the people they loved. Over a couple of Jameson's, he tells Joe about the Wizards, Indian monks with an incredible secret.

Sanyal's lowly caste made it impossible to educate himself in their ways, but he knows what they can achieve.

Sanyal discovered the masters had taken a special interest in an American by the name of Herman Walker, a professor at Syracuse University. Walker had followed his daughter to India, intrigued by her PhD studies. He lived in the northern village of Pithoragarh for five years, long after his girl returned to the US, fascinated by the Zen Masters knowledge of metals.

Now Walker is back in New York, key to a scheme that will shake an already violent world to its core.

THE PLAN

Walker will do anything if they kidnap Victoria. In his universe, the sun rises and sets with her.

Rumpleman grabs her from a shopping mall car park in the middle of the day. If she does not comply, her youngest dies. They drive for hours, destination unknown until he hands her off to his unconventional colleagues at a rest stop on I95 South. He warns them to take care of her...

Despite his inner struggle, Victoria exerts a strange influence over Rumpleman. Perhaps inexplicably she reminds him of Molly, dead all these years.

Sanyal follows the action from his villa in Spain. Rumpleman returns to the Walker residence in NY. Victoria is fine, but the professor will never see her again if he doesn't follow precise instructions. No police. No FBI.

The demand is simple. The Irishman gives Walker twenty-four hours to transform 250 lbs. of lead into gold. Yes, he knows all about the five years in Pithoragarh. It's time to put the Wizard's alchemy theories into practice.

Exactly one day later, Walker emerges from his basement laboratory with the gold. He demands his wife's return, but Rumpleman informs him of the real assignment. The gold was just a test. He must transform 40 lbs. of lead into plutonium. No police. No FBI. When Rumpleman gets the plutonium, Walker gets his wife. Be smart or she dies...

Walker is a frightened man. Gold is one thing but handing over plutonium to a degenerate means putting millions of people at risk.

The men holding Victoria in McIntosh County, Georgia, speak like Rumpelstiltskin. She tries to outsmart them but to no avail.

In the small town of Darien two local detectives, Samuel Pyles and a Geechie woman, Alicia Lemon inadvertently pull over two of the gang for speeding. After questioning the men and feeling merciful, the cops release them with a warning. The following day, a dispatcher sends Pyles to investigate an abandoned vehicle down a dirt road; the same car they pulled over for speeding. Inside the trunk lies a filthy, very dehydrated, Victoria Walker.

The cops try to piece together what's happening. Pyles also charmed by Victoria's charisma, flies to New York to interview the professor. The local police and FBI are present. Walker admits he gave the gang gold but lies about any plutonium. They would never believe him. Soon, they suspect he is complicit in his wife's kidnapping.

Victoria calls the cop that evening to inform him about the plutonium. Pyles' fear of nuclear material in the wrong hands outweighs his skepticism. His partner, Det. Lemon is hot on the trail of the gang as events escalate. A Geiger counter reading at the scene of a bomb blast in Savannah confirms a radioactive substance is indeed present.

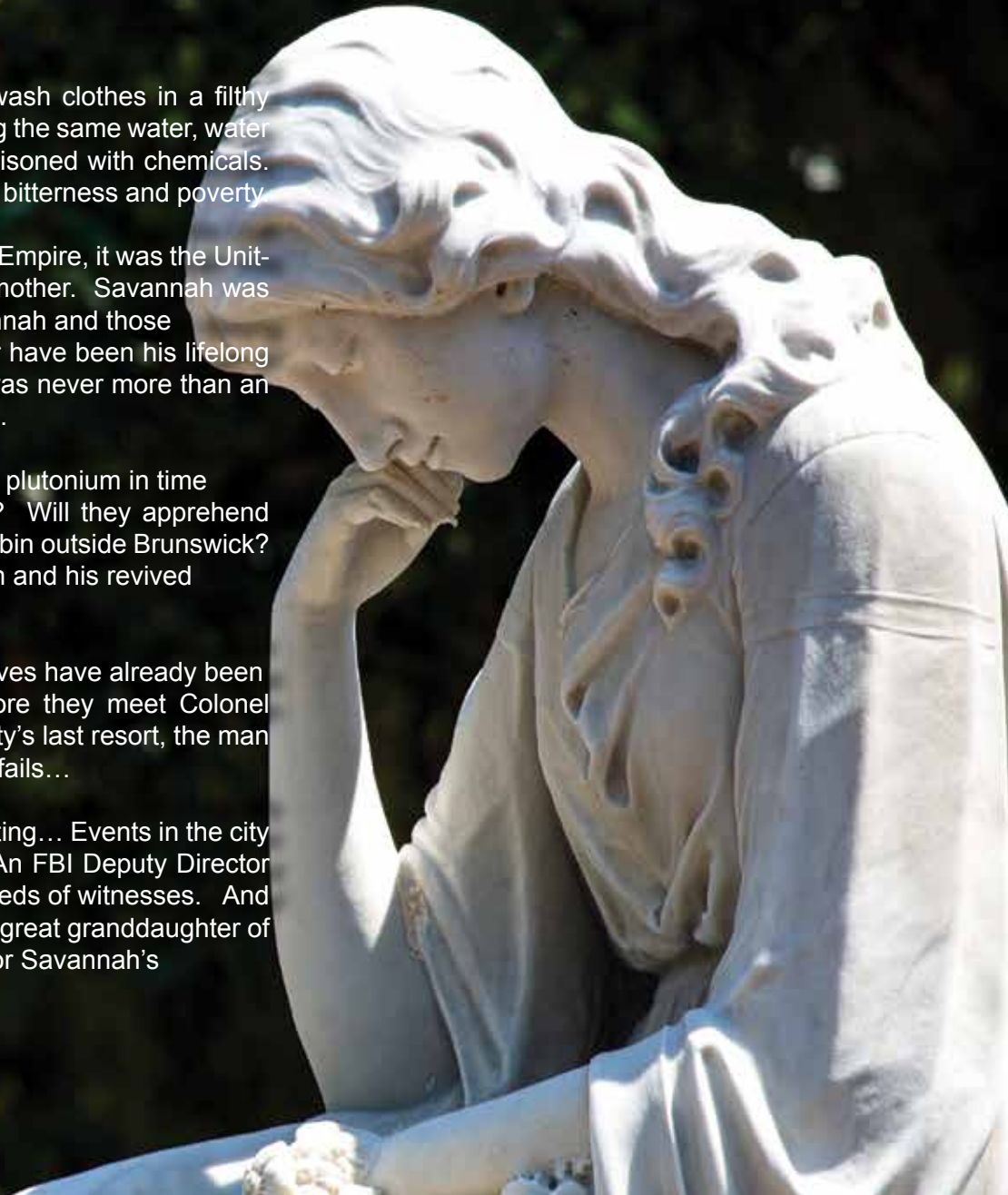

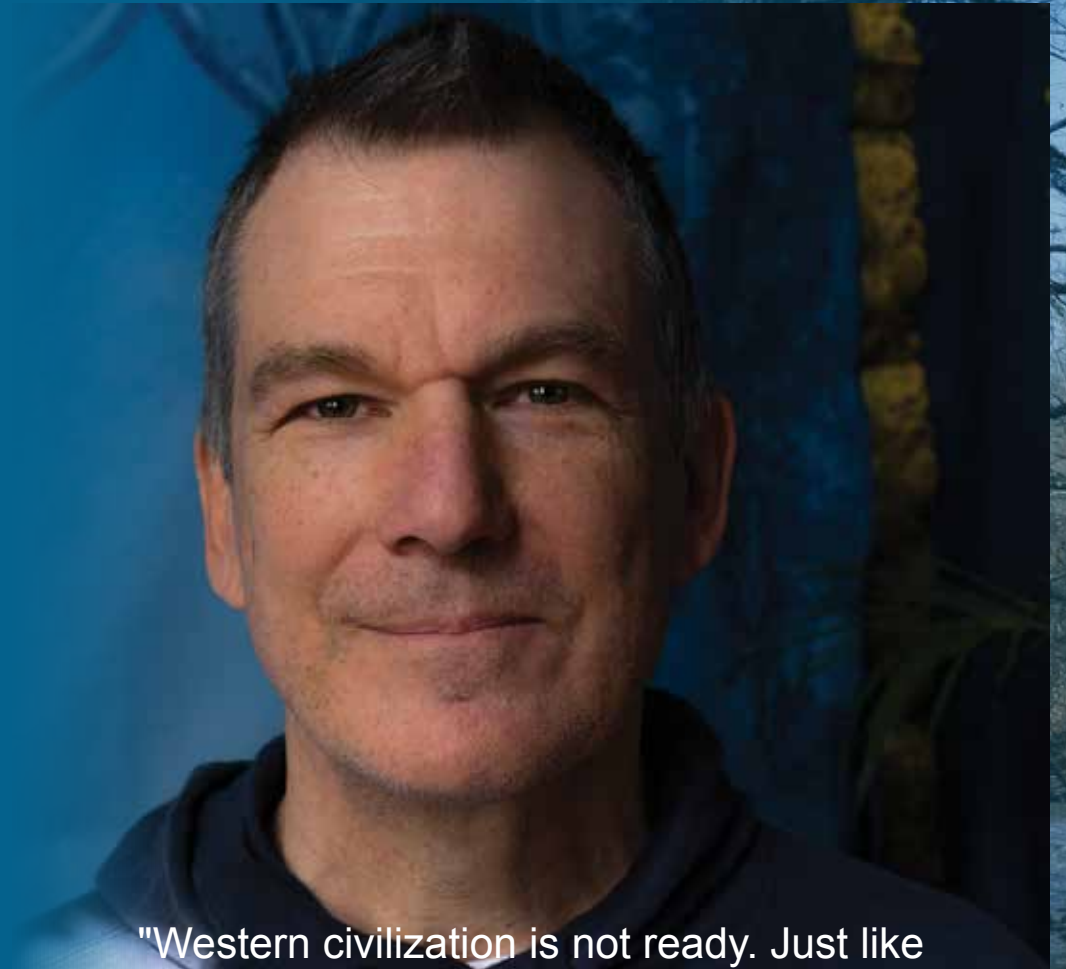


Herman Walker, PhD

Revenge is sweet after a lifetime of caste, deprivation, and poverty...

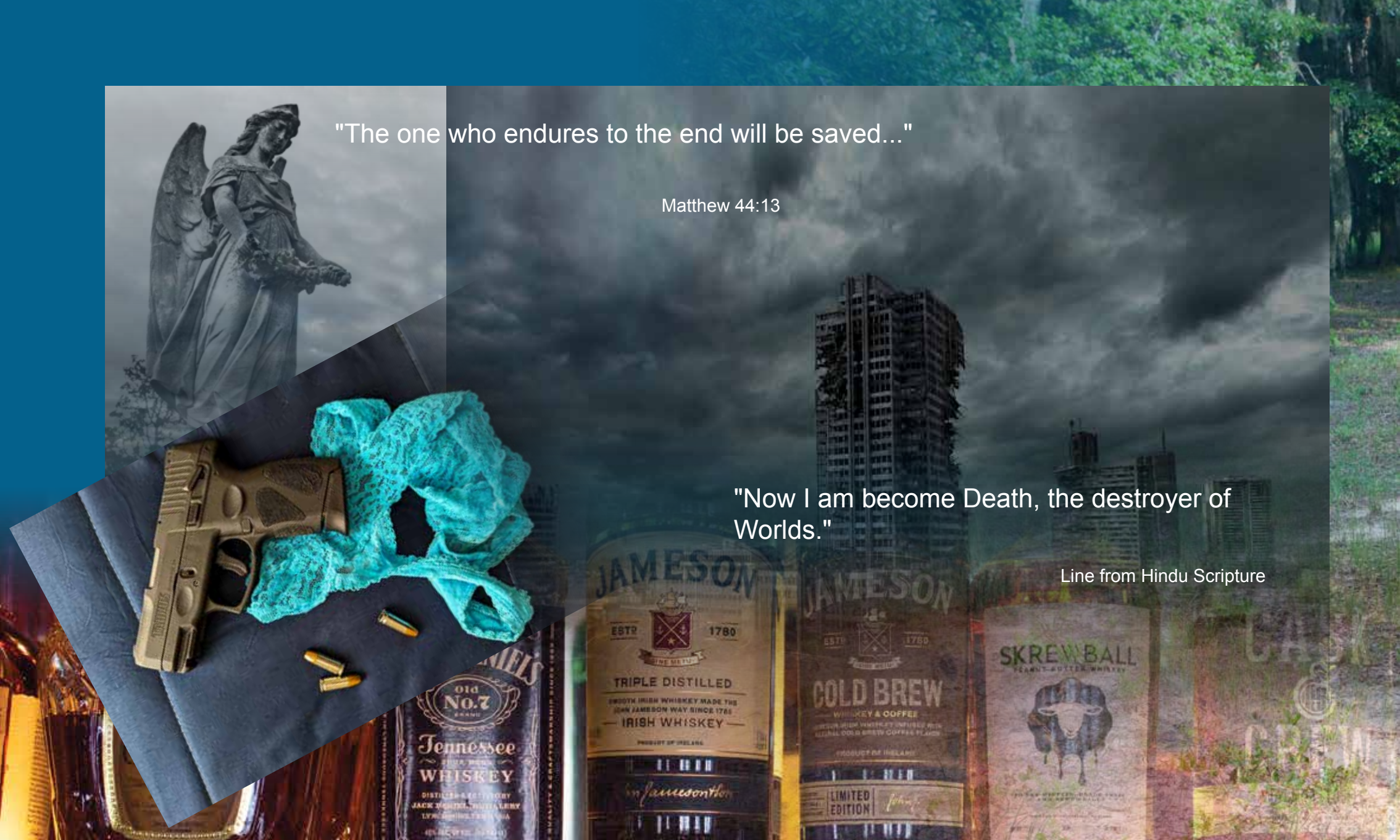

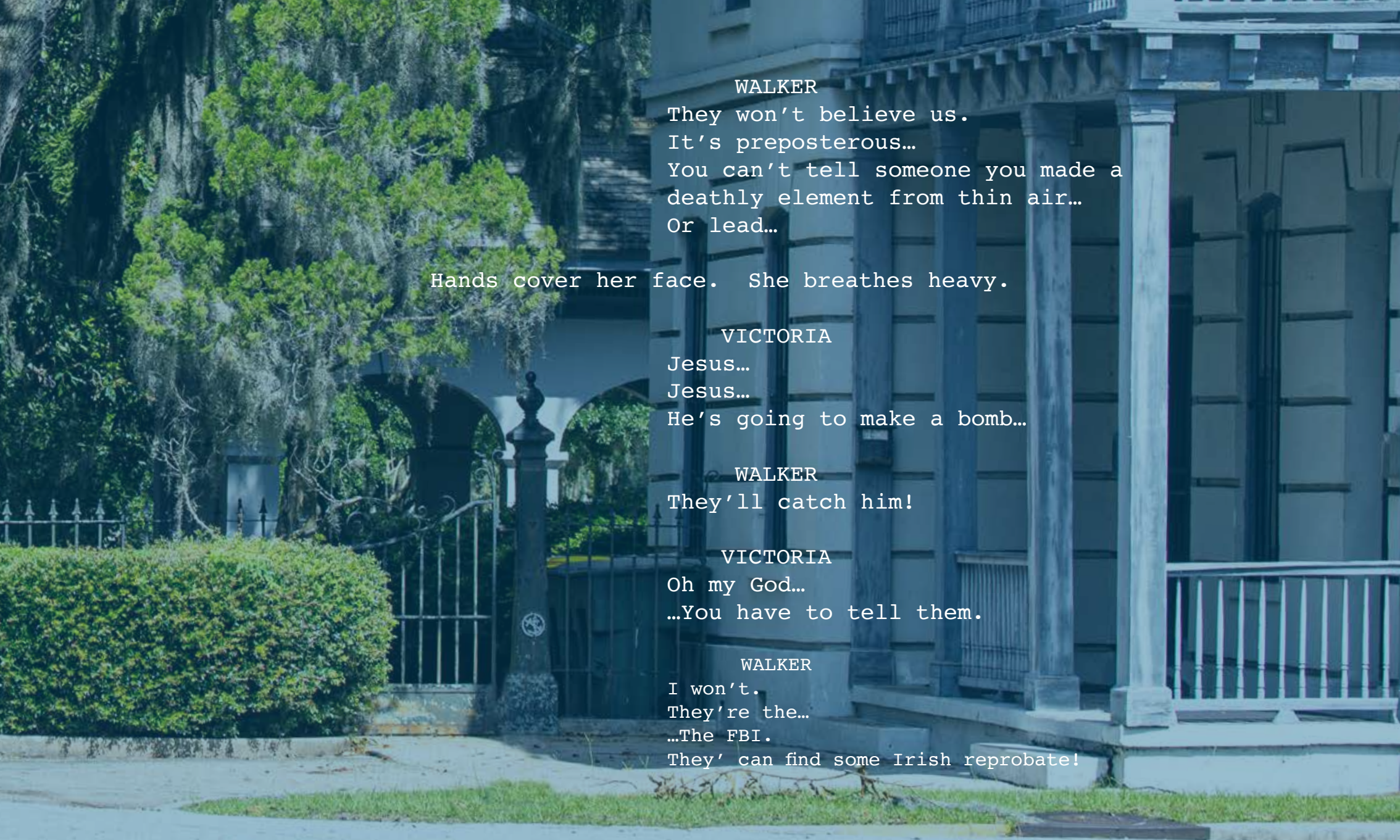
Ronan has directed numerous music videos and has worked in several Irish schools as a tutor in Film Production and Film Studies.
