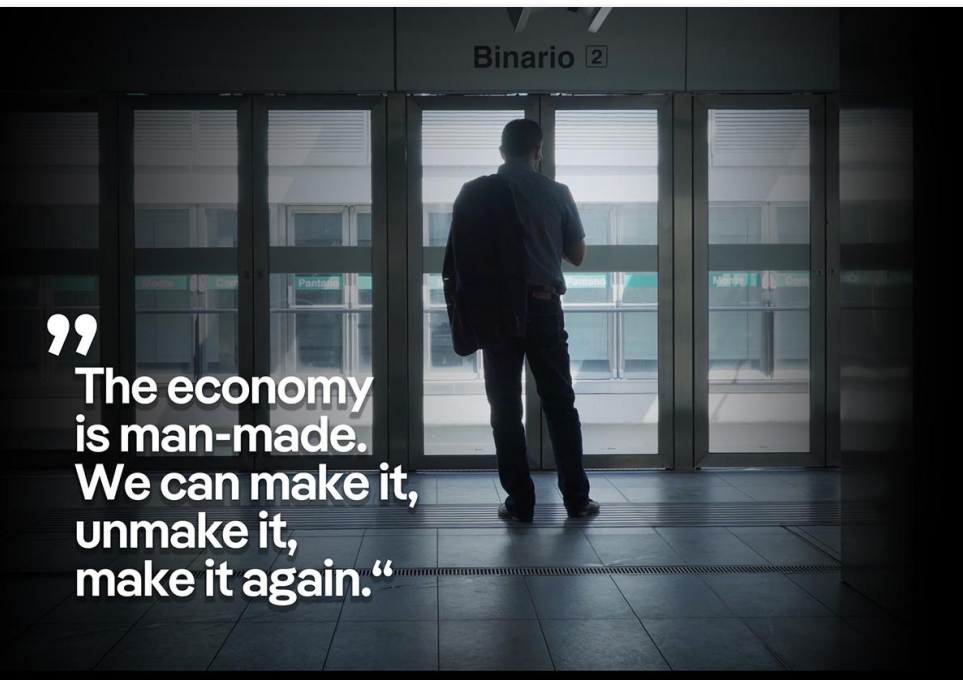


Purpose
