REPORT OVERVIEW:

What began as a documentary project centered on a single, decades-old memory has rapidly escalated into something far more profound. We arrived in Wirksworth, Derbyshire, to film Arthur Peterson's reluctant return to a town haunted by his own inexplicable encounter in 1985. We expected fragments, whispers, perhaps some local folklore. What we found was an escalating pattern.

KEY FINDINGS (PRELIMINARY):

Public records, including a 2016 Matlock Mercury report detailing a couple's encounter with low-flying, disc-shaped objects, confirm ongoing aerial activity within the town's airspace.

4. **Derbyshire's Enduring Enigma:** The local phenomena in Wirksworth are not an anomaly. Our investigation revealed a consistent historical thread across the county:
 - **Bakewell (1993):** Numerous credible witnesses, a large, silent, structured object.
 - **Bonsall (Ongoing):** A consistent hotspot for activity, including compelling but debated video footage.
 - **Stoney Wood / The Stardisc:** This reclaimed quarry, now a site of natural beauty, houses the Stardisc. Its creator, Aidan Shingler, designed it, in part, as a means of *communication with alien lifeforms*. Its very existence here, overlooking Middleton Moor (another site of high activity), cannot be dismissed as mere coincidence.

5. **Expert Analysis Dr Elliott Matthews and Dr Reid** Preliminary interviews with Dr. Matthews and Dr Reid, both renowned researchers, confirm these regional patterns align with global high-activity zones. He posits that Derbyshire may be a location where the veil between the 'seen' and 'unseen' is remarkably thin.
