

Georgina Elizabeth Okon is a British-born Nigerian actor, voice-over artist, storyteller, and filmmaker. She has lent her voice to several feature films, including "The Woman King," "Black Panther," "Bandida 2 (Outlaw)," "Simply Black," "School Life," "Street Flow 2," and various television series such as "Pride & Prejudice: Atlanta," "Scorpion," "Oh Hell," "Tarragon," "The Break," "Unit 42," and "Mortel."

Georgina was cast as the lead in the film-noir crime fiction podcast "Hell California."

As of April 2024, Georgina received exciting news regarding her audio narration for "The Invenios Expedition," a spin-off of the award-winning podcast "The Leviathan Chronicles." The producers were so impressed with her performance that they decided to expand her role and consider creating a new show featuring her. "The Invenios Expedition" live stream premiered earlier this year. The Invenios Expeditions was nominated for Best Scripted Fiction Podcast in the 2025 Signal Awards and is currently on the running for the Listener's Choice Awards.

In addition to her voice work, Georgina Guest-Starred in television shows like "Bob Hearts Abishola" and "Shrill," as well as in the HBO short film "The Family Meeting," Nickelodeon's "The Really Loud House," and the award-winning short film "Fugitive Zero." Her performance in "Fugitive Zero" garnered ten nominations and resulted in her winning seven "Best Supporting Actress" awards.

Georgina has also voiced characters in the video game "Eolia" and narrated the audiobooks "One Year in Uvalde" and "A Love Like This." Additionally, she performed in an adaptation of Shakespeare's "Much Ado About Nothing," titled "Nothing, Nothing," which was written by Anima Henry and directed by Elisa Bocanegra of Hero Theatre. This production received three

nominations and won the LA Theatre Bites 2023 award for "Best Original Los Angeles Show."

Georgina recently starred in the lead role of a feature-length film titled "Not Every Woman," which is currently in post-production.

In addition to acting, she co-wrote, co-edited, produced, directed, and starred in her first short film, "Etched," for the Reimagine iPhone Film Fest '25. This film was one of three winners of the Showcase Prize. Etched then went on to be "Officially Selected" at the "Christian Online Film Festival" and won the Mini-Film Award. Etched just been Officially Selected at the Last Evangelist Film & Music Festival.

Georgina will shooting the Repercussion Short Dance Film later this year, where she will showcase her expressive dance abilities. Furthermore, she hosted "The Afrik Regalia African Fashion Show & Cultural Event" earlier this year

Additionally, Georgina performed in the staged reading of the play "The Park," written by New York playwright Eric Conger and directed by three-time Emmy Award winner Cadi McClain, at the Marilyn Monroe Theatre.
