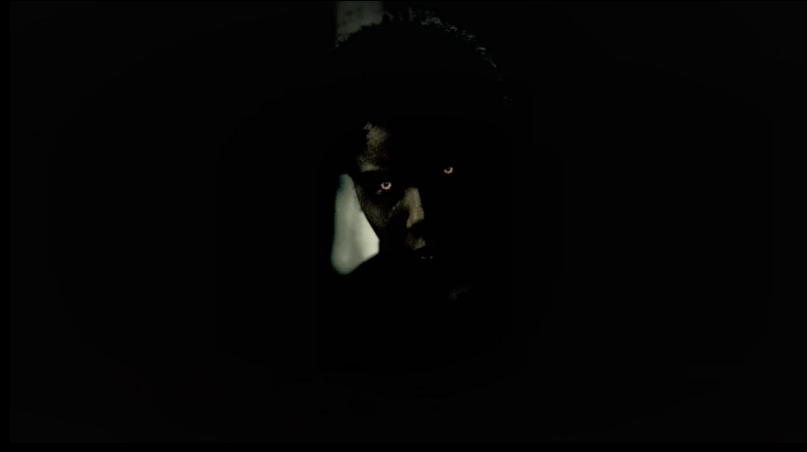

Logline

A queer Black person is stalked by a spectral presence that blurs the line between memory and malevolence, forcing them to confront buried trauma before it consumes them.



Director Statement



HAUNTED was born from the kind of fear that doesn't just live under the bed; it lives in the body, the mind, and memory. As a young, queer, Black artist, I've found that the scariest parts of life aren't the monsters, but the silence. The rumination. The repression. The ghosts of who we used to be... or who we tried not to become.

This story emerged from my own questions about identity, survival, and what it means to live with grief that has no name. What haunts us when we're alone with our thoughts? What happens when a long-buried truth claws its way back into the present?

HAUNTED is intentionally intimate: a single voice, a single space, but an emotional terrain that runs deep. Crafted with minimal dialogue, it relies on mood, silence, and stark imagery to pull the audience into a liminal space where the line between real and unreal vanishes. Each frame and sound was designed with restraint, deliberately evoking a sense of dread without spectacle.

It's a meditation on shame, identity, and the long shadow of trauma, wrapped in the eerie language of supernatural horror and grounded in quiet humanity. With influences ranging from Jordan Peele to real-life true crime stories, *HAUNTED* is as much about isolation and memory as it is a ghost story.

Horror allows us to confront truth through metaphor. In that confrontation, we find catharsis. *HAUNTED* offers viewers a glimpse into the terror of holding something in too long, and the rupture that follows when it finally breaks free.
