Bruce is one of the most original and genuinely curious young men I have had the privilege of advising, a student who thinks differently about almost everything and brings that quality to every room he enters. He set out in September with a clear artistic goal: to produce a film that represented a summation of everything he was capable of, and by FOCUS Festival, he had done exactly that and then some. The film was the best student film I have ever seen at SAC: riveting, poignant, and deeply human, it revealed not just technical skill but a genuine artistic vision. Academically, the year was harder than he expected, and Bruce was honest about that in every reflection, naming the tension between his creative ambitions and the demands of a rigorous course load with real self-awareness. What I observed across the year was a student learning, sometimes painfully, how to protect both his art and his academics without sacrificing either. He ran cross-country in the fall, transitioned to Nordic skiing in the winter, and finished with track in the spring, building a level of physical fitness he is genuinely proud of and did not expect to achieve. Through our ACPlus program, he tried bagpipin and acrylic painting, sang with Andrean Voices, led the stop-motion animation sessions with enough skill and enthusiasm that the program will continue because of him, and carved his own canoe paddle in preparation for SASSAW in Temagami this July. His contributions to the Arts Council, where he took on a genuine leadership role in supporting the school's creative community, rounded out a year of remarkable breadth. In Cadets, he rose to the rank of Major and will serve as Adjutant of the Corps next year. The young men in our advisory group look to him and appreciate his support. I look forward to seeing what he creates next year.
