

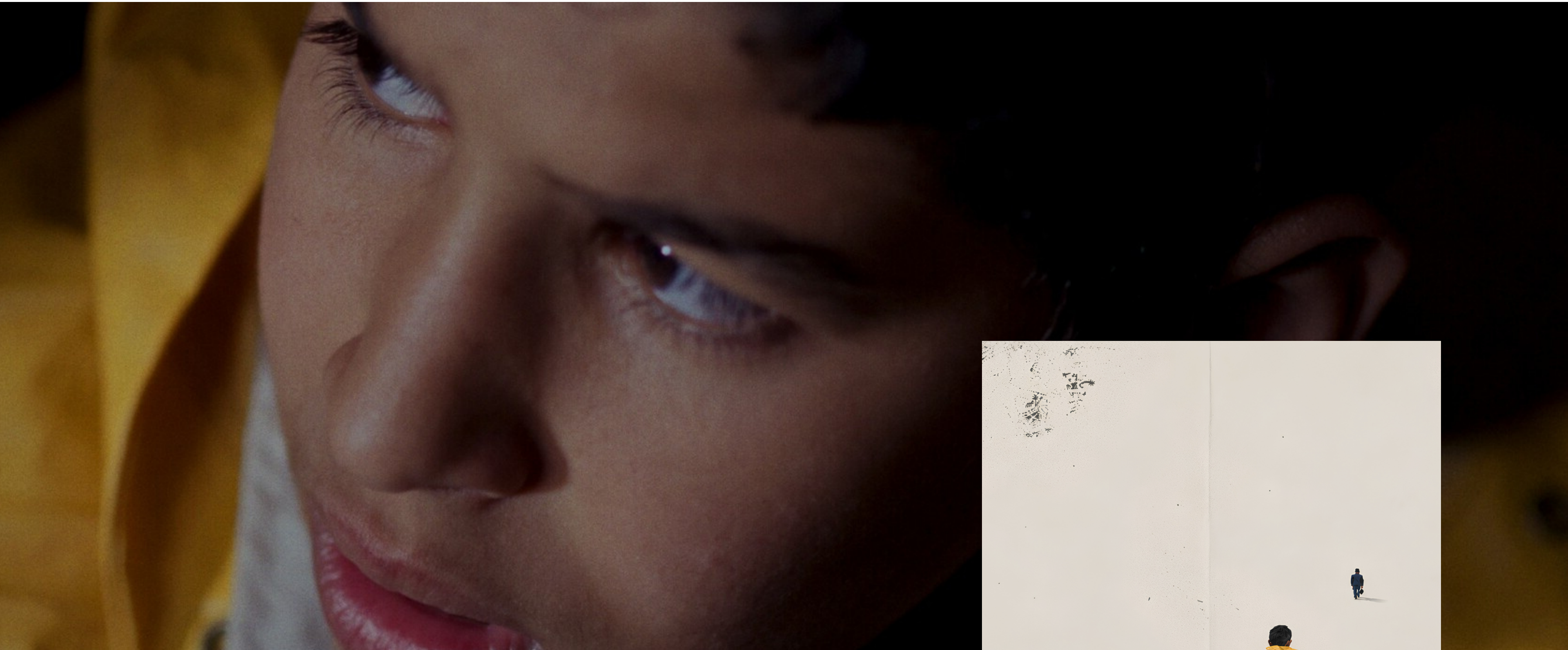

synopsis

Algeria, 1992. As the country sinks into violence, two schoolboys walk seven kilometres every day to get home. After witnessing a terrorist murder, they flee and stop a passing van. Inside are two silent men — and a long road ahead. What begins as a familiar journey suddenly becomes a claustrophobic passage into fear and suspicion.

director's statement



I did not want to tell a story about the years of terrorism that Algeria experienced in the 1990s, but about the mark they left on childhood. What interests me is not the historical event itself, but the way a familiar world can, almost without warning, become foreign. Childhood has its own perception of time and space: time feels vast, distances seem endless, and the world still appears to make sense. I wanted to capture that state before it disappears.

The film is built around a shift in perception. Serenity is not the opposite of violence; it is what makes violence more brutal when it suddenly arrives. I wanted the direction to first allow time, landscapes, silences, and bodies to breathe, before gradually making their transformation felt. Cinema then becomes a physical experience: space closes in, time contracts, and looks change. What was familiar becomes suspicious, and what once seemed insignificant becomes a threat.

At its core, 7 Km is about the loss of meaning. When familiar references disappear, incomprehension creates a space where fear can take hold, followed by suspicion. I do not want to explain this violence, but to make the audience experience the moment when it becomes impossible to understand. Through a deliberately contemplative form that gradually shifts into tension, I seek a cinema in which the audience does not simply watch a story, but feels a world changing before their eyes.

biography

Oussama Benhassine is an award-winning Algerian screenwriter and filmmaker. He began writing for television in 2008 before moving into directing. His directorial debut, *Desert Rose* (2023), was selected by several international festivals. *7 Kilometers* is his second short film. His work explores Algerian history, memory, and human stories through a cinematic and intimate approach.

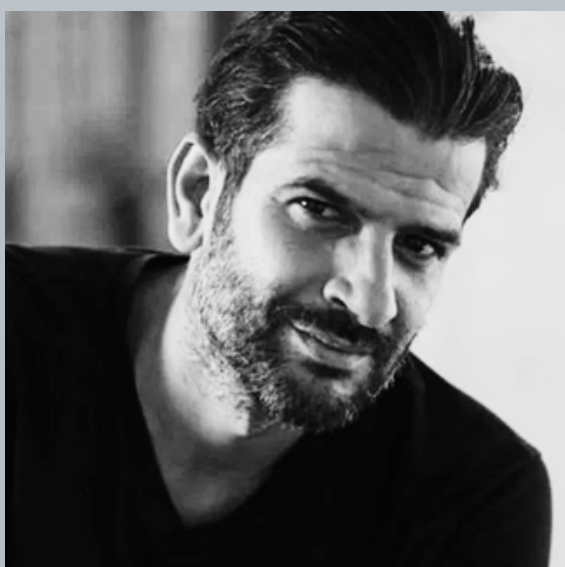

The Children: A Search for Raw Truth

To embody the vulnerability and innocence of the two schoolboys, an intensive street-casting process was conducted in Hammam Guergour, an isolated region nestled high in the mountains of the Sétif province.

Over 70 local children were auditioned through multiple workshop stages. Khalil Bensaqli and Mohamed Chouadra emerged as the natural choices—non-professional young actors whose unfiltered gaze, deep connection to this rugged mountain landscape, and natural bond bring an undeniable truth to the screen.

The Men in the Van: Local Roots & Experience

Slimane Benouari (The Passenger)
A prominent figure in contemporary Algerian auteur cinema, Slimane Benouari gained international recognition for his powerful leading role in Amin Sidi-Boumédiène's *Abou Leila* (Cannes Semaine de la Critique 2019), followed by performances in *La Dernière Reine* (The Last Queen, 2022) and *Alger* (2024). Native to this very same isolated mountain village of Hammam Guergour, Benouari brings a quiet, threatening intensity to the silent passenger in the van.

Issam Benouari (The Driver)
In a striking piece of real-life synergy, Issam Benouari—Slimane's real-life brother—plays the driver. Shared roots in the high mountains, unspoken family dynamics, and a deep familiarity with the terrain create a subtle, palpable tension within the claustrophobic space of the vehicle.
